#### 4.0 **Procedures**:

- 4.1 Grantee/Delegate and ISD Staff will provide a responsive, organized, child-centered learning environment that is representative of the individual lifestyles, culture, and language of the children in the classroom. 1302.31(a)
- 4.2 ISD staff will plan a balance of adult-and child-initiated activities, and active and quiet activities including individual small group time, large group time, and center learning environment time. Teachers will develop activities appropriate to the child's developmental level and respect their preferences. 1302.31 (c) (1) (2)
- 4.3 Daily activities are predictable to children. A "child friendly" management system which includes: rules, schedule, procedures, attendance, and center management charts are posted which keeps children informed and on task. 1302.31 (c)
- 4.4 Labeling and arrangement of of materials fosters independence allowing for the easy access and return of these materials.---1302.31 (c)
- 4.5 Each classroom will have age-appropriate equipment, resources, and materials to meet the individual developmental needs of each child, including children with disabilities.
- 4.6 Materials are intentionally and periodically changed to support children's interests, development and learning. --1302.31 (d)

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- 4.7 Classroom materials will provide opportunities to explore and experiment which will encourage open-ended communication--including music and movement supplies, puppets, play figures, and books.--1302.31 (d)
- 4.8 Grantee/Delegate and ISD staff will provide materials to engage infants and toddlers to use their senses through physical contact, sounds, textures, and tasting/smelling of food.
- 4.9 The program will ensure that facilities and equipment meet ADA standards for children, staff, and parent to enable equal participation in all activities.
