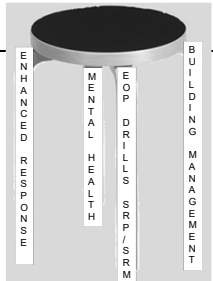

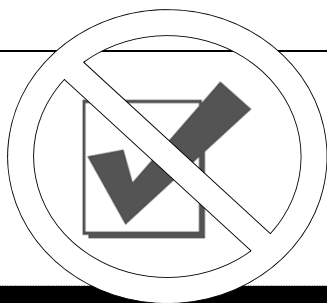

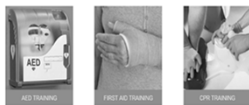
By the Numbers

27	incidents in 16 states
213	casualties - excluding the shooters
85	killed
2	law enforcement officers
1	unarmed security officer
128	wounded*
6	law enforcement officers
27	shooters - 23 male, 3 female, 1 at large†
10	committed suicide
11	apprehended by police
4	killed by police
1	killed by citizens
1	at large
9	incidents ended with the exchange of gunfire between the shooters and law enforcement

School Safety Training (TX Code Code: 11.100)	School Marshal Plan (TX Education Code: 37.0862)
<p>Purpose: To provide students and faculty an armed self-defense option prior to the arrival of Law Enforcement in the event of an active shooter or "active killer" on campus.</p> <p>Training Required: *18 Hours by licensed and certified instructor *80% 90% required live fire qualification and simulation training *Focus on safety stopping active shooter until law enforcement training or responsibility *Can be personalized to student and district</p> <p>Basic Points *18 hours training *Self and simulation based *Customized to each school's policies and rules *Customizable training plan *Choice of on or off-site training *Designated for 3 purposes: PROTECTING STUDENTS FROM AN ACTIVE SHOOTER PRIOR TO LAW ENFORCEMENT ARRIVAL.</p> <p>Cost Average cost for certifying and maintaining 5 participants: \$1,800</p>	<p>Purpose: To provide certification for educators enabling them to possess and carry a handgun. The plan allows educators to act as armed security officers and possible peace officers in the absence of law enforcement.</p> <p>Training Required: *80 hours by TCOLE licensed instructor (mostly classroom) *Only 75% live fire qualification required *Includes arrest procedures and use of force *Focused on security/law enforcement duties *Strict State requirements and rules</p> <p>Basic Points *80 hours training *Mostly classroom based *Districts must adhere to State/TCOLE (one size fits all) *Handgun must be in locked container *REQUIRES use of potentially dangerous flammable arms *More comprehensive training prior to live fire training *Must go to TCOLE approved Police Academy for training *Designed to use Teachers/Employees as security personnel with the added safety</p> <p>Cost Average cost for certifying and maintaining 5 participants: \$30,000+</p>

- Stop the Bleed- <https://www.bleedingcontrol.org/>
- 3 hour training on direct pressure, tourniquets, and wound packing that can be provided by local law enforcement, fire, EMS, hospital staff, and others.
- School staff with the following credentials can become district trainers: MD, DO, RN, CRNA, NP, PA, DDS, DMD, DVM, PharmD, Pharmacist, LVN, LPN, RD, RT, PT, OT, DCM, DPM Paramedic, EMT, EMR/First Responder, Sworn Law Enforcement Officer, Ski Patrol, Athletic Trainer, TCCC-MP Instructor (both actively practicing and retired Instructors are eligible to be instructors), and TECC Instructor
- Sec. 38.029 - BLEEDING CONTROL KIT PROGRAM - All campuses will need a bleeding control station

- Drills that trained for, practiced, and debriefed
- Standard Response Protocol / Standard Reunification Method



EMERGENCY OPERATION PLANS AND DRILLS

- Emergency Plans made with collaboration with First Responders
 - Chain of command
 - Knowing what law enforcement and first responders need, want, and will do
 - Will the police, sheriff, or highway patrol office at your school weekly
 - Teacher and substitutes trained in how to respond
 - Building shutoff located and people assigned with tool to mitigate disaster
 - Student with special needs pre-cared for
 - Do you have a plan for a train or pipeline accident required within a 1000 yards of school

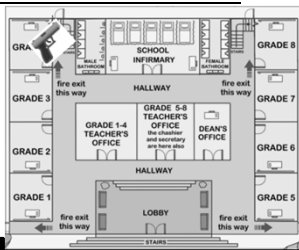


EMERGENCY OPERATION PLANS AND DRILLS

Drills that are trained for, practiced, and debriefed

The commissioner, in consultation with the Texas School Safety Center and the state fire marshal, shall adopt rules:

- designating the number of mandatory school drills to be conducted each semester of the school year, not to exceed eight drills, including designating the number of:
 - evacuation fire exit drills; and
 - lockdown, lockout, shelter-in-place

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SHELTER! Hazard and safety strategy.

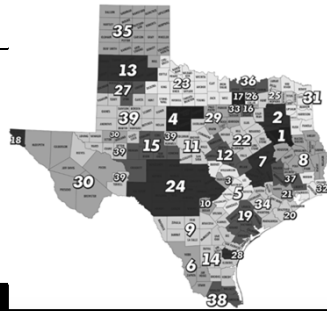

Youth Mental Health First Aid

- Health and Safety Code 161.325 and TEC § 37.115
- This is a funded mandated training
- 8 hours face to face with manual provide to staff
- It covers mandated reporting, mental health, substance abuse, and suicide

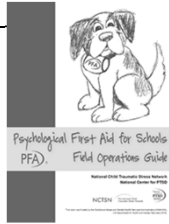

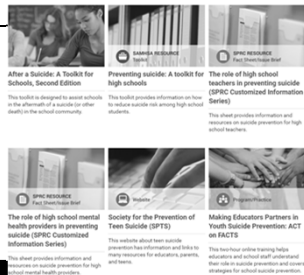
- The landmark Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) study found higher levels of traumatic experiences in the general population than previously imagined.
