### BOY Assessments

I know, I know... The last thing you want to think about is assessments right now. However, it is paramount to remember that **TEA requires all Pre-K students to be assessed for BOY within the first 60 days of school, AND there are FIVE domains that are required to be assessed for each student:**

- Emergent Literacy: Language & Communication (*Rapid Vocabulary*)
- emergent Literacy: Reading (*Rapid Letter Naming*)
- Emergent Literacy: Writing (*Early Writing Skills Checklist*)
- Mathematics (*All measures within Mathematics*)
- Health & Wellness (*All measures within the Social & Emotional Checklist*)

## DEVELOPMENTALLY APPROPRIATE PRACTICES

### Centers

Just like everything else, Center expectations need to be taught explicitly, and you need to model expected behavior (including materials use and care). Also, don't overload centers with too many options at the beginning of the year. **Less is more** as you teach the **routines and procedures** for center time. And - don't forget - the more you label, the easier it is for students to clean up after themselves and put things back where they belong!



**ABC Centers** - Minimal activities, labeling with photos and/or words, books to support letter knowledge



**Pretend & Learn** - Books, writing materials, manipulatives to make apple pastries, labels for each item... all to support the Apple Orchard!



**Science** - Fixed amount of materials needed to focus on the idea of magnetic/non-magnetic, including meaningful print about what a scientist is.



**Construction** - Labeled baskets with manipulatives & "I can build" statements to support their construction play

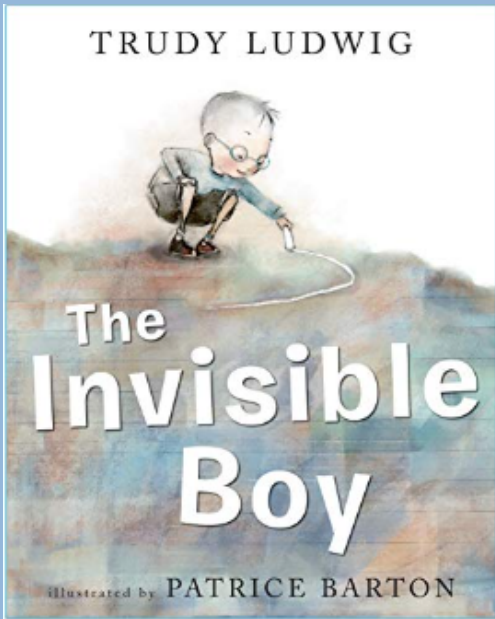

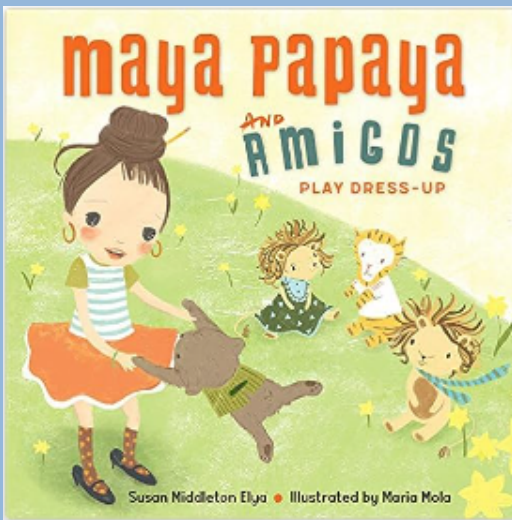
## The Invisible Boy

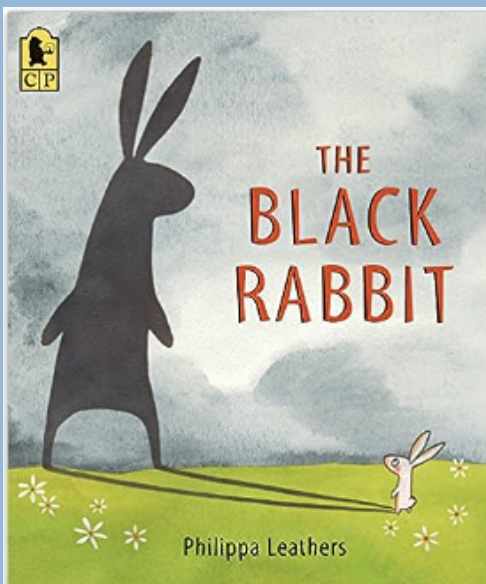


## Maya Papaya and Amigos Play Dress-Up
